13th: *Dick Dale* is often known only as "King of the Surf Guitar", but he was much, much more than that. Dale's work with *Leo Fender* pushed the boundaries of amplified music for live performance and his sound inspired many rock musicians too. Notably, Dale was mentor to a young player who would become known as *Jimi Hendrix* wrote *Third Stone from the Sun* in tribute to Dick when he was given only six months to live back in 1966. Dick Dale survived a lot longer than that: he died at the age of 81 on the 16th of March.

50 YEARS AGO



It was, perhaps, the beginning of the end of the first Golden Age for Radio Six. Radio News promised a new raft of programmes; new disc-jockeys, new programmes and a new look to the paper. Yet the station was only a little over six weeks away from terminating daily programmes. *Tony Currie* was about to leave school, and the hobby station was to be consigned to cardboard boxes in a cupboard at the beginning of June.

Curiously, none of the programmes or presenters trumpeted on the cover above appeared during the week in question. Indeed, some didn't appear at all. But it would seem that at this juncture, *Tony* hadn't made his mind up to end it all come the summer.

There were highlights, though. The station extensively covered the triumphant return of round-the-world yachtsman *Robin Knox-Johnstone* to Falmouth harbour. *Ronan* continued to rave-up several times a week, and Radio News promised an entirely new approach as a twice-weekly A5 size paper. As you'll see next month, that didn't last long - in fact only until the supplies of green A5 paper ran out!
