As the New Year settles in, and we get the first month over and done and try to remember which year to write on documents, Radio Six International settles in to its familiar format - but of course there are some variations.

For a start **THE PLUGGIN BABY RADIO SHOW** has had a bit of a raw deal when it comes to the Sunday afternoon repeat - so from this month Emma Scott has two regular times in the week - Saturday at 19:00 GMT and Sunday at 16:00 GMT.

EUROPE'S HEARTBEAT is moved out of rotation with our speech programmes and now finds itself on the Eurovision trail on the first Sunday of the month at 18:00 GMT, with a repeat the following Wednesday at 06:00 GMT for our New Zealand listeners.

This month we say hello to Frieda Morrison, one of Scotland's best-known award winning broadcasters, who joins us for the monthly **SCOTS RADIO** broadcast in the Scots language. That's not Gaelic, by the way, but the tongue spoken traditionally in the Scottish Lowlands, Northern isles and Northern Ulster. Join Frieda and see how much you can understand!

There are two **WRITER'S BLOCK RADIO HOUR** programmes this month, because having sought contributions for a show themed on love and Valentines, Glen Dickson found himself swamped with great material. So we've spread it out over two hours on Feb 10th and 17th at 22:00 with the usual repeats. This means **TRAILER TRASH** pops up a week later than usual, on feb 24th, and there isn't an edition of **CULT STATUS** this month.

OFF THE SHELF is having the entire series of six repeated in its entirety, because the first transmission was all over the place. So you can join Tony Currie for a listen to some of the odder pieces of vinyl in the record library on Sundays at 18:00 GMT, except for the first Sunday of the month.

We say a fond farewell to Finn Nixon as host of **WHAT'S IN THIS WEEK'S OBAN TIMES** because he has left Oban to join The Courier in Dundee as a transport reporter. His colleagues made a special surprise podcast to wish him goodbye, and when he was asked what his favourite story had been over his career at the paper, he instantly chose to recall the day he spent on Lismore nat Radio Six International! But fans can still hear Finn as he's also part of Frieda Morrison's **SCOTS RADIO** team. Happy listening!
