We've traditionally celebrated Beltane for many years here at radio six international, but what exactly is it? Our friends at Wikipedia tell us, "Beltane or Bealtaine is the Gaelic May Day festival, marking the beginning of summer. It is traditionally held on 1 May, or about midway between the spring equinox and summer solstice. Historically, it was widely observed in Ireland, Scotland, and the Isle of Man. In Irish the name for the festival day is Lá Bealtaine while the month of May is Mí na Bealtaine, in Scottish Gaelic Latha Bealltainn, and in Manx Gaelic Laa Boaltinn/Boaldyn. Beltane is one of the four main Celtic seasonal festivals - along with Samhain, Imbolc, and Lughnasadh—and is similar to the Welsh Calan Mai." Our celebration this year features Tony Currie with another edition of **One Morning** in May on Wednesday 1st May at 07:00 GMT (that's 8am UK, 7pm New Zealand).

The Grand Final of this year's Eurovision Song Contest takes place in Malmo, Sweden on May 11th, so Ewan Spence will assuredly be bringing us news and music from there in this month's edition of **Europe's Heartbeat** which airs at 22:00 GMT on May 11th immediately after the final (although Ewan is recorded so he won't know the result!).

We are intrigued to learn of a meeting of two of our great musical minds this month, as Eric 'Record Box' White and John 'Soundwave' Cavanagh tell me they are planning a gettogether in Norwich, home of the Record Box. We hope that something of their meeting may be recorded for posterity!

Next month we celebrate 61 years of broadcasting from **radio six international**. Doubtless, there will be some special programmes, but there are strong rumours of spectacular new jingles. Stay tuned.....
